De Beauvoir Primary School Proposed Sports Premium Funding 2017 -2018



What is the Sports Premium?

The Department for Education (DfE) provide funding to schools in order to improve the quality of sport and PE for all pupils. The funding was first issued to schools during the academic year 2013/2014. From September 2013 – July 2017, De Beauvoir received £37,071 in Sports Premium funding. At De Beauvoir, we are committed to ensuring that pupils understand the importance of being active, having a healthy lifestyle and enjoying sports and games activities. This year, Sports Premium funding increased. De Beauvoir has been allocated £18,790 for the academic year 2017-2018.

At De Beauvoir we have decided to use the Sports Premium to:

- increase pupils' participation in sports and physical activities at break and lunchtimes;
- to further improve the quality of teaching in PE;
- to improve the provision of sports in after school sports clubs.

Sports Premium Funding - September 2013 – July 2017

During 2013-2017 funding was used to provide:

- New PE equipment;
- Alternative sport opportunities from outside companies such as Brazilian capoeira, kayaking at Laburnum boat club, the Arsenal Double Club, swimming lessons at Britannia Leisure Centre and provision from Badu Sports;
- The introduction of new sport activities and encouraging more pupils to take part in new sports such as fencing, street dance and table tennis;
- Current staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sports more effectively;
- Involvement and support for the least active children, and those are eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant, by running after school sports clubs and a Change4life club;
- Participation in sports competitions within the borough;
- Increased pupil participation in inter-school games.

Sports Premium Funding 2017 – 2018

Our school has been awarded £18,790 for the academic year 2017 -2018. We intend to use the funding in the following ways:
